

2022 Board Priorities

Assure safe and healthy communities.

- 1. Protect public health by minimizing infections and limiting severe and fatal outcomes due to COVID-19.
- 2. Create more affordable and supportive housing in Olmsted County through new and enhanced housing development tools.
- 3. Reinvest in the justice system to be fiscally and socially impactful and address inequities and racial disparities.
- 4. Expand, refine, and measure the Pathways Towards Prosperity and Well-Being practice model to include more clients and teams within Health, Housing, and Human Services.
- 5. Complete reaccreditation of Public Health Services.
- 6. Address racism as a public health issue and elimination of inequities in our community by implementing results of the Racism as a Public Health Issue study.
- 7. Develop and enhance supports for children of incarcerated parents.

Be good stewards of our built and natural environments.

- 1. Complete environmental documentation, design, and right of way acquisition at the CSAH 44 (formerly CR 104)/TH 14 Interchange. Secure funding for construction of the proposed interchange and associated fly-over at 7th Street NW.
- 2. Implement Ash Utilization Project by constructing a pilot roadway section at the Kalmar Landfill using bottom ash from the Olmsted Waste-to-Energy-Facility (OWEF) as the aggregate base of the roadway.
- 3. Advance the master plan for Graham Park and continue evaluating adjacent "Seneca" property.
- 4. Plan for a Materials Recovery Facility (MRF) in Olmsted County including legislative advocacy for state bonding support.
- 5. Complete an open space plan to address the common connectivity, recreation, and environmental needs of the county.

- 6. Develop and enhance strategies to incentivize property owners to improve groundwater and soil quality.
 - 7. Create a vision for waste management within Olmsted County and identify long-term sustainable solutions for the disposal, recycling, or reuse of wood waste with the City of Rochester and other partners.
- 8. Complete and open the new Oxbow Nature Center.

Maintain the foundations of democracy.

- 1. Complete county redistricting of commissioner districts to reflect 2020 Census data.
- 2. Successfully administer the 2022 mid-term Elections as measured by canvass results and the Post-Election Review.

Provide operational excellence.

- 1. Invest American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds in projects that make a difference for generations.
- 2. Integrate One Olmsted goals within all departments, including defined and measurable annual plans in each department.
- 3. Improve the strategies and tools used to recruit and retain high-quality staff including developing a compensation strategy and focusing on recruitment, with special attention to attracting diverse applicants.
- 4. Prepare a climate change sustainability and resiliency plan for Olmsted County based on an inventory completed in 2021.
- 5. Implement the next phase of long-range facility planning including Justice Tower & remote/hybrid work implementation.
- 6. Modernize our technology specifically by moving to a paperless, integrated, and supported document management system(s) in Health, Housing, and Human Services.
- 7. Minimize cybersecurity risk by improving our disaster recovery posture and increasing the availability of our systems.
- 8. Maintain our levy per capita ranking among Minnesota counties.
- 9. Plan for our organizational strategic direction and upcoming transitions in our elected leadership.
