Mandated Reporting MN Stat 245A.66	<p>Required annually. Mandated reporter training will discuss how to make a mandated report in Olmsted County, including how to reach intake (nights and weekends), what information is helpful to provide when making a report, and what happens to the information after you make a report. If you attend the Minnesota Foster Care/Adoption Education Class prior to licensing, this class includes the required Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder and Children’s Mental Health and additional 4 hours of training in attachment and trauma.	16 hours
