Olmsted County Attorney Mark Ostrem announced today that an Olmsted County Grand Jury issued an Indictment on January 24, 2024, charging Mustafa Rahshad Bush with one count of Murder in the 1st Degree-Premeditated and with Intent, one count of Murder in the 1st Degree-Pattern of Domestic Abuse and an additional count of Murder in the 2nd Degree with Intent.

Mr. Bush had previously been charged with 2nd Degree Murder by complaint. The Grand Jury Indictment is considered the new charges and the original complaint is replaced with the indictment. Pursuant to Minnesota law, the Indictment authorizes a Life in Prison penalty. If convicted of either Murder in the 1st Degree charge, Mr. Bush shall be sentenced to life in prison without possibility of release.

The Indictment stems from an investigation into the death of Kimberly Robinson who was found in rural Olmsted County on December 26, 2022. Ms. Robinson had been in a relationship with Mr. Bush and last seen at a holiday party on Christmas Eve, 2022. Following an investigation, law enforcement determined that Ms. Robinson died from a gunshot wound. The Grand Jury found probable cause that Mr. Bush intentionally and with premeditation was responsible for her death. The Grand Jury also found probable cause that Mr. Bush caused her death while committing domestic abuse and had engaged in a pattern of domestic abuse toward Ms. Robinson.

The date for Mr. Bush's arraignment on the Indictment has not yet been set.
