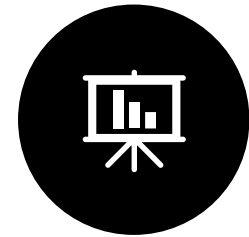

Demographics

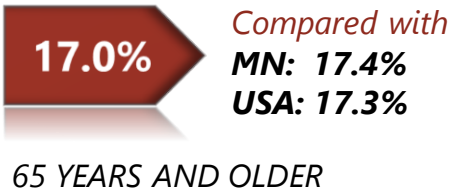
➤ Olmsted County's population is growing, with a 14.2% increase since the 2010 Census.

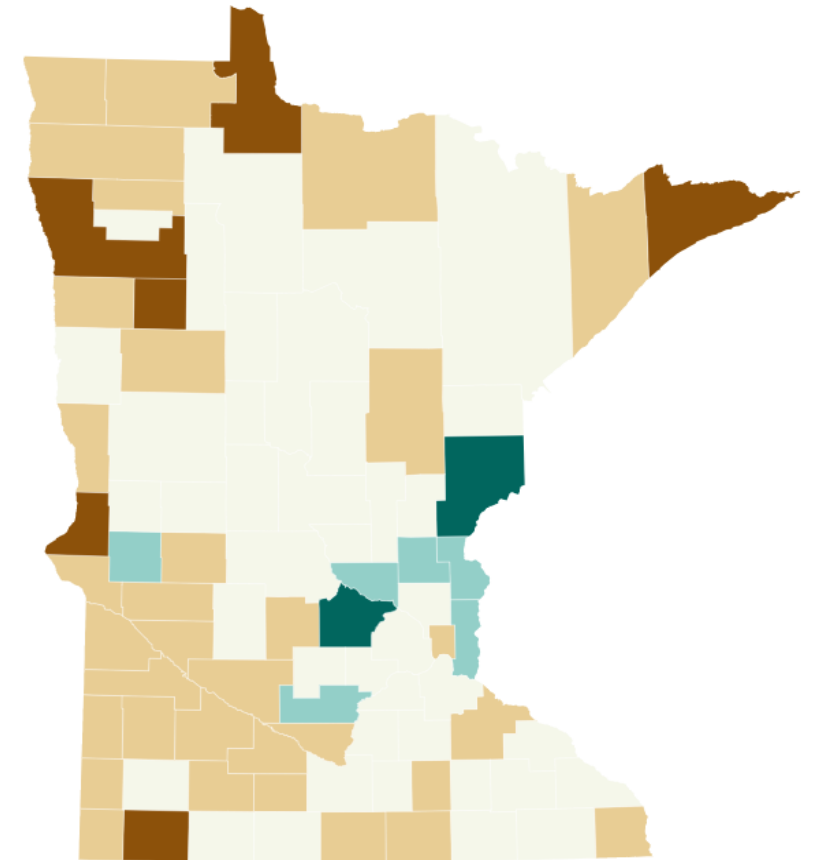

Minnesota counties, estimated population change 2022-23

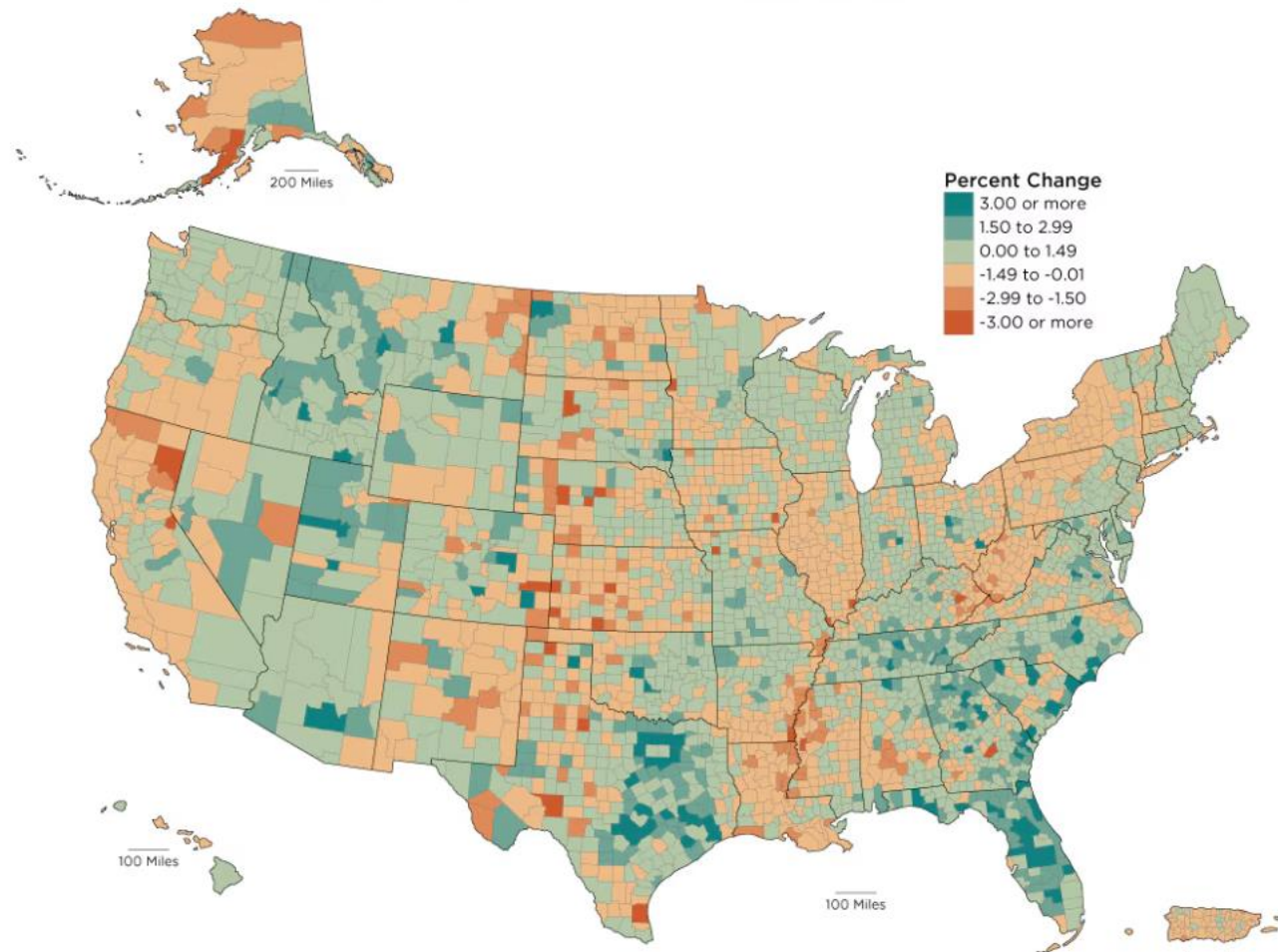

Percent Change in County Population: July 1, 2022, to July 1, 2023

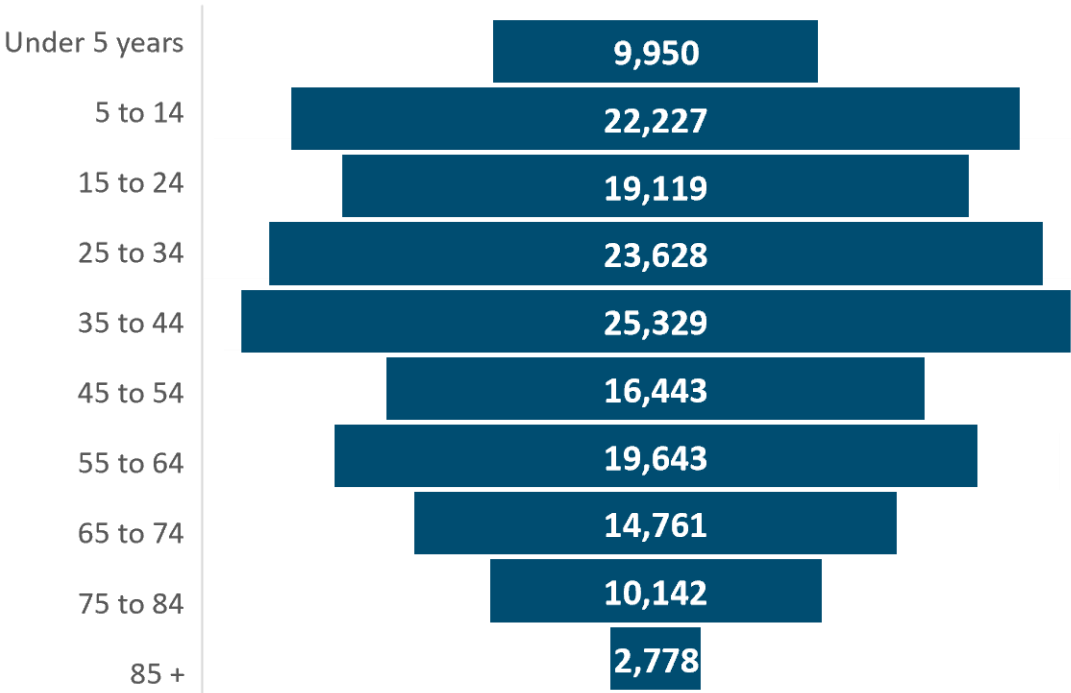

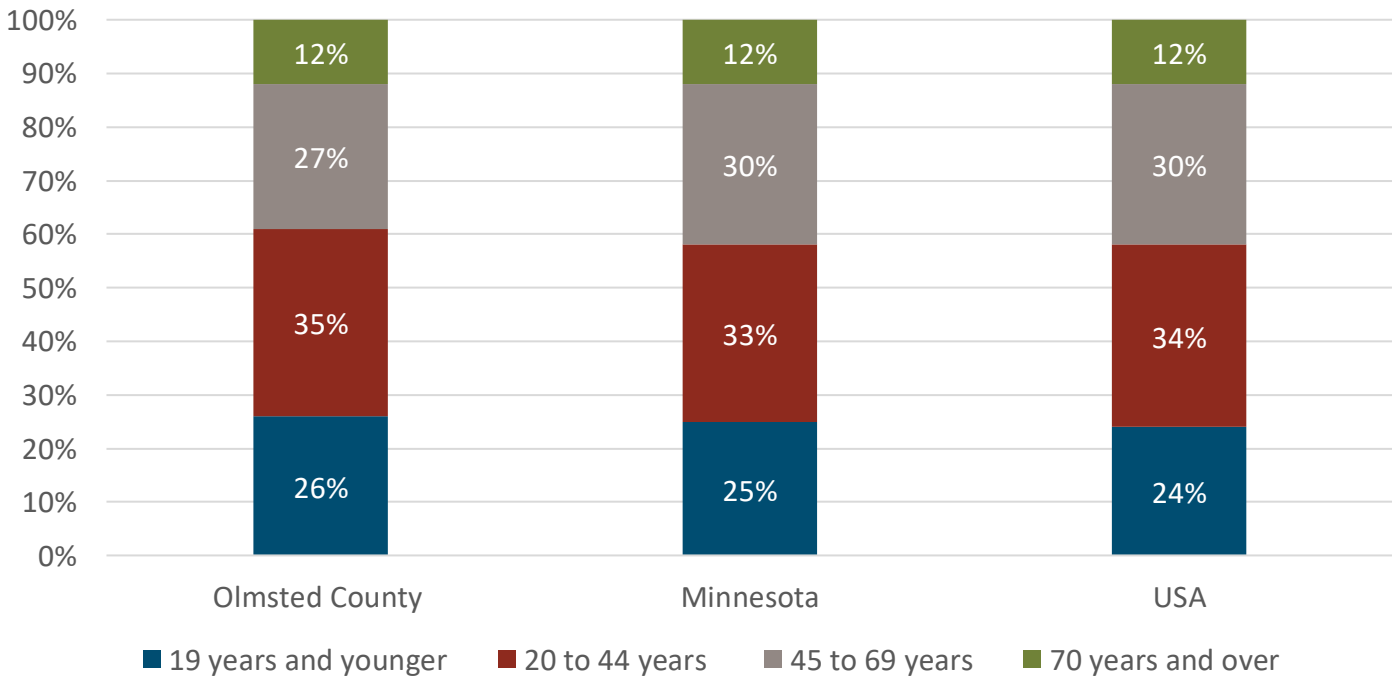
Population by Age

- Olmsted County's highest population group is 35- to 44-year-olds changing from the highest being the 25- to 34-year-old group.
- Olmsted County sees a higher younger population (14 and below) than the state and nation.

Racial & Ethnic Diversity

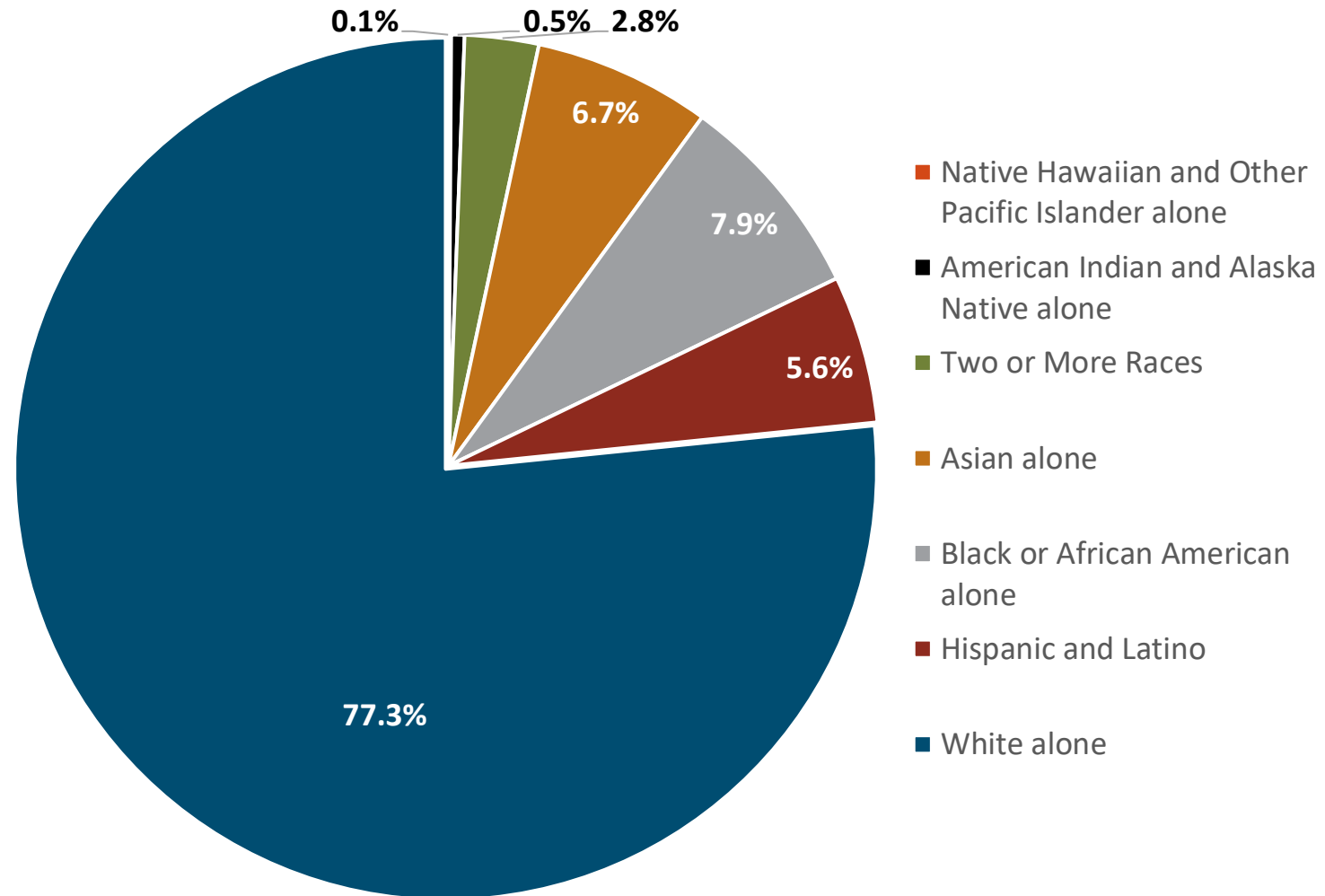
- Olmsted County's non-white population grew by **37%** since the 2010 Census

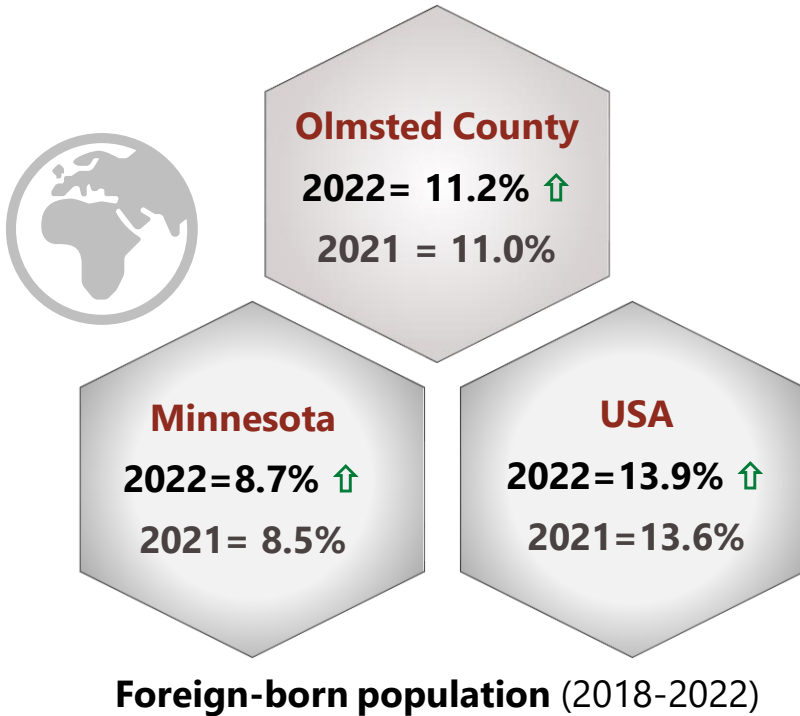

Foreign-Born Population



- 11.2% (↔ from 2022; 11.2%) of Olmsted County's population are foreign-born in 2023.
 - As of 2022, 44.3% have become naturalized US citizens.
 - As of 2022, 94.9% of Olmsted County residents were US citizens, which is higher than the national average of 93.4%.

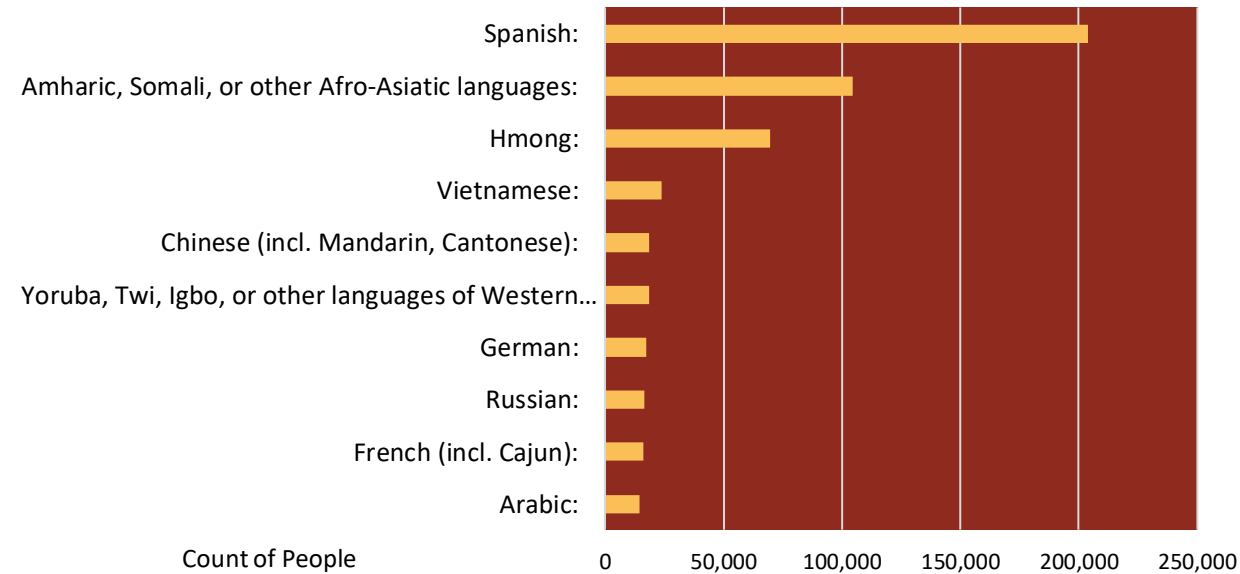

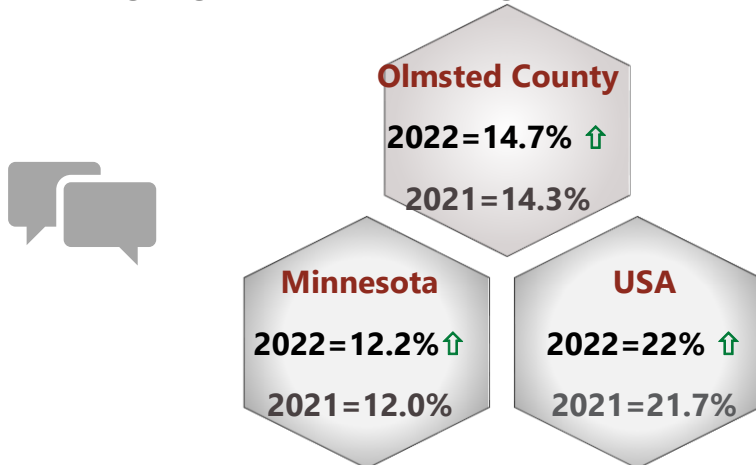

Languages other than English spoken at home (2022)



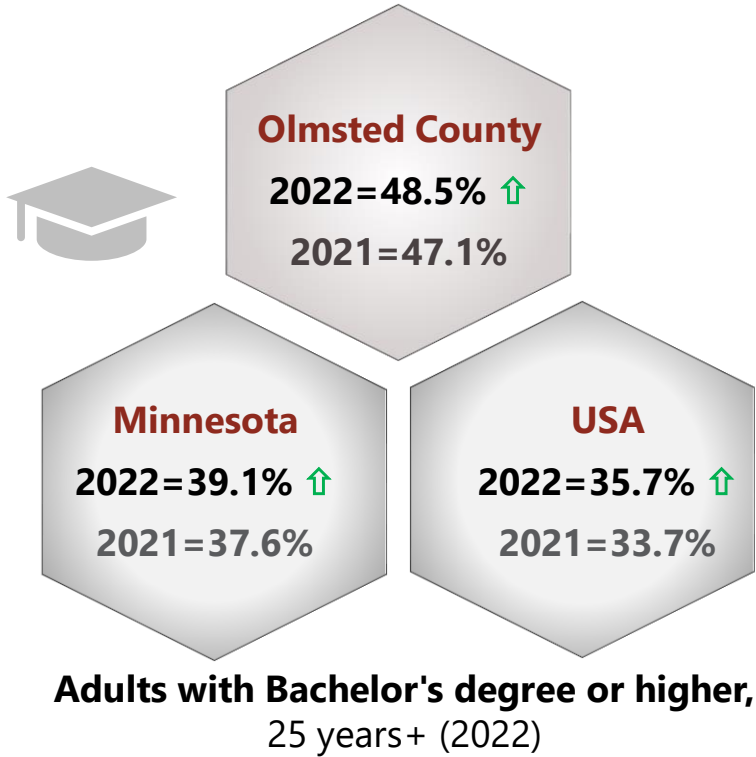

Educational trends



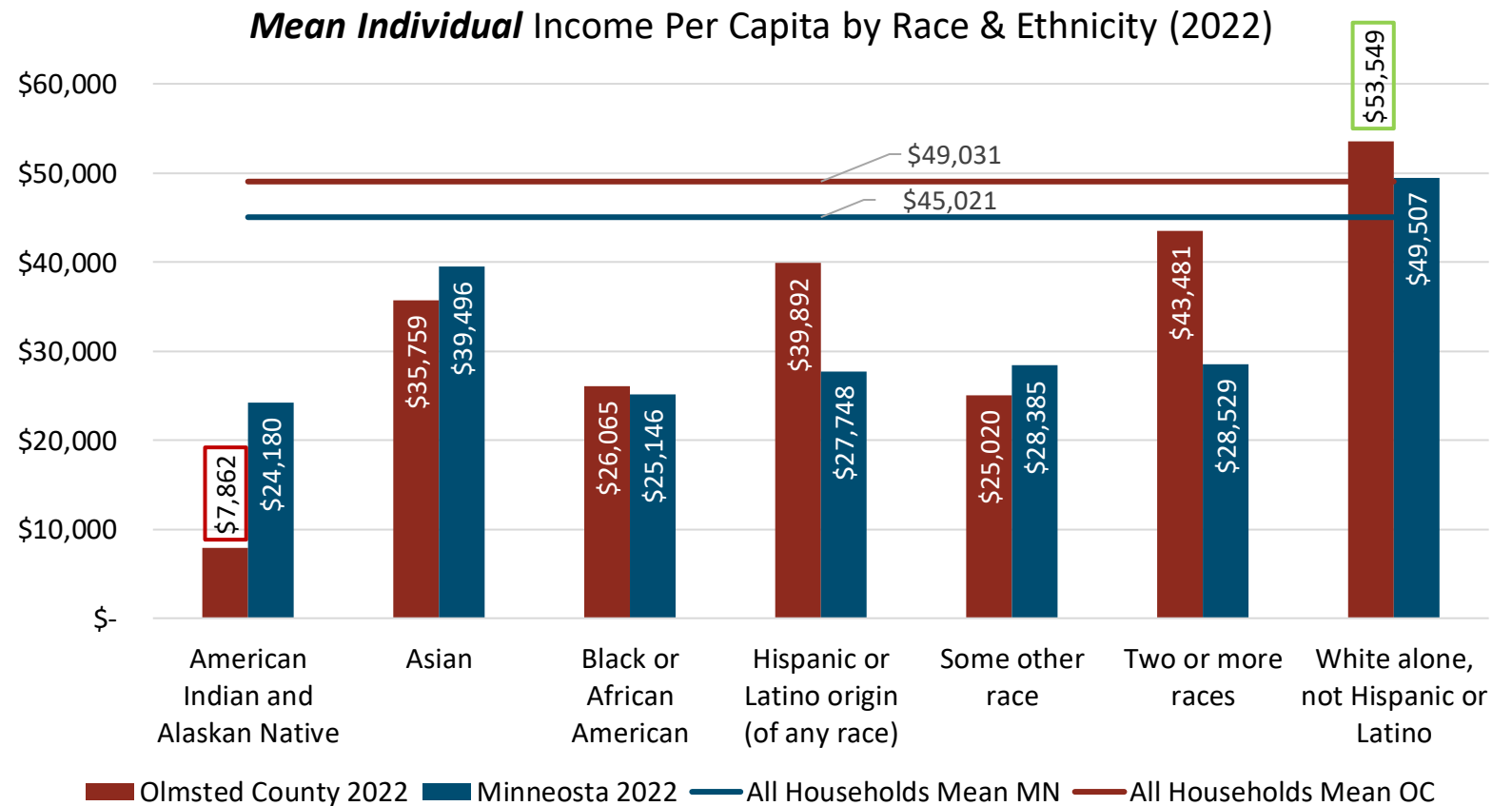
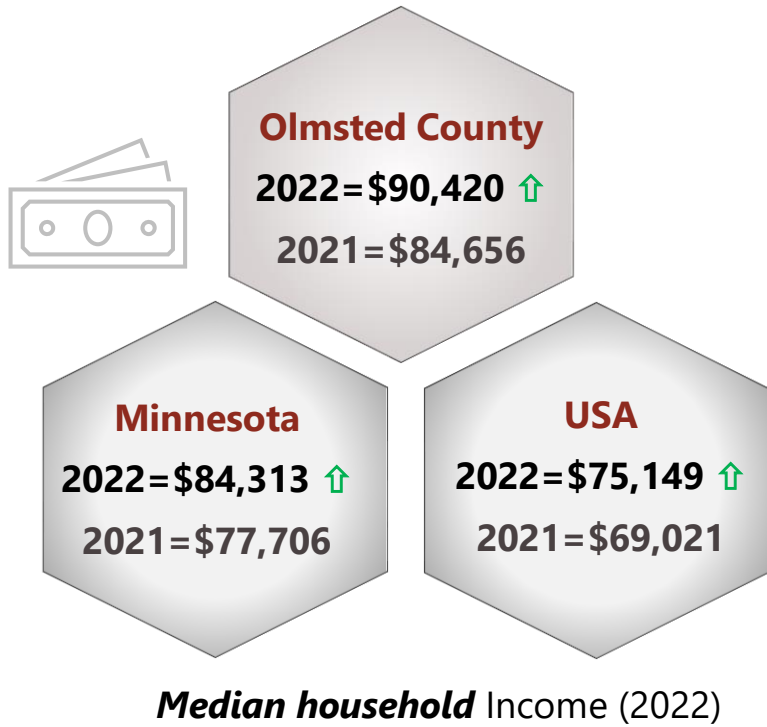
- Olmsted County has a higher educational rate than MN and USA.
- At least 67.8% of people of all races have attained a high school diploma, with rates lowering for Black students.

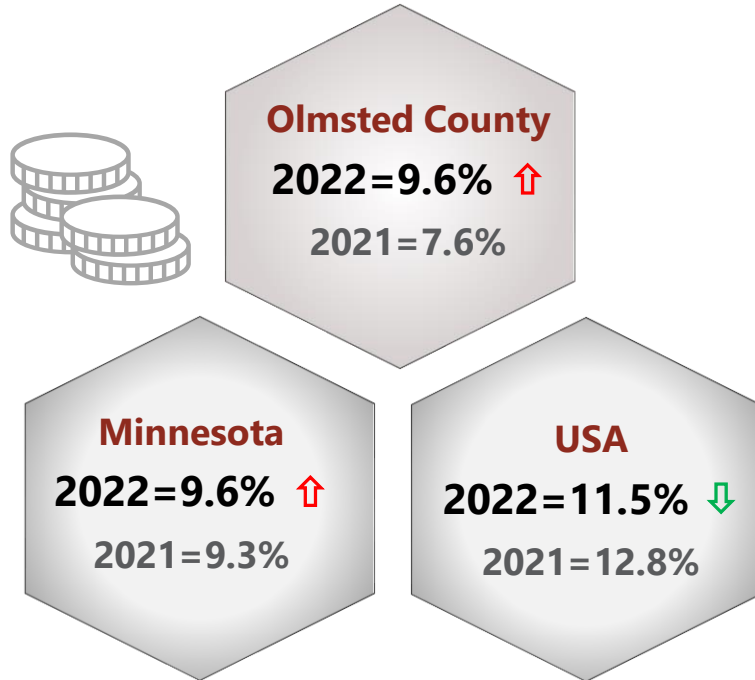


Individual Income

- Olmsted County has a per capita average/mean individual income of \$49,031, which is 8.9% higher than MN.
- Individuals identifying as American Indian and Alaskan Native have the lowest mean income in Olmsted County, with \$7,862.

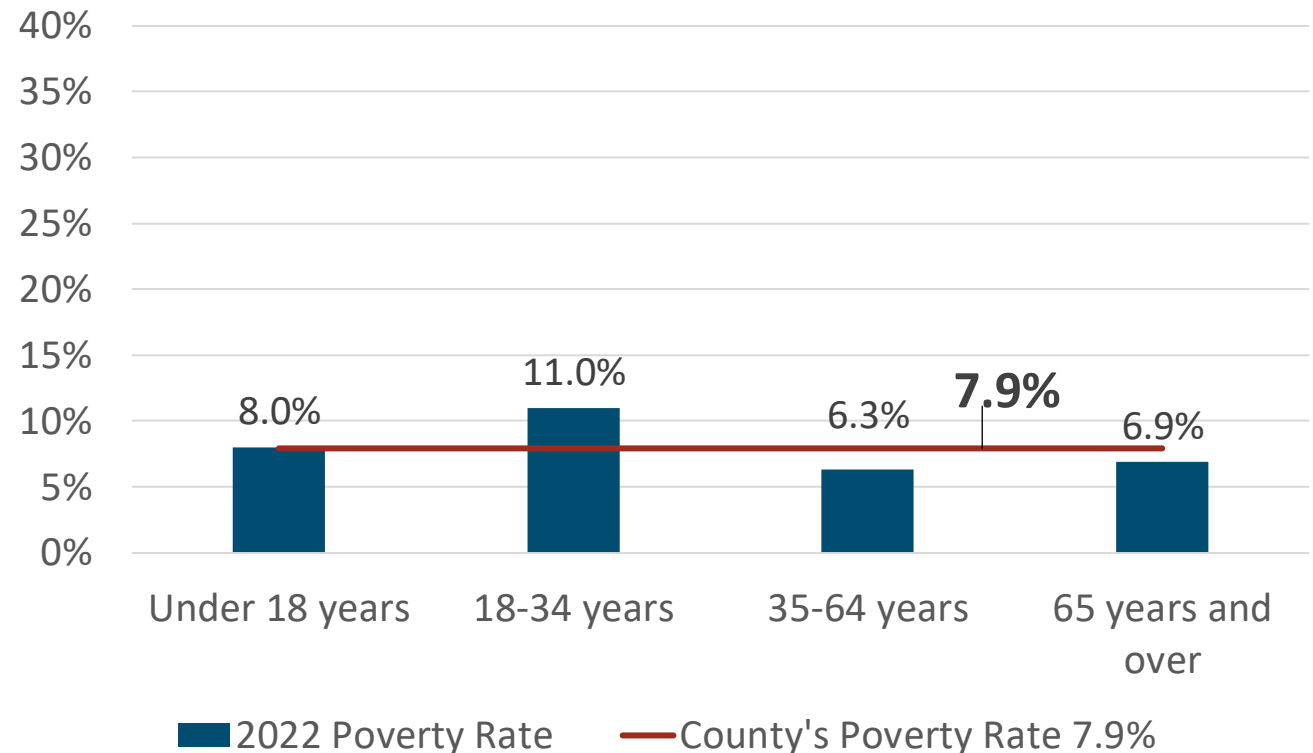


Poverty Status



- **7.9%** of the population in Olmsted County live below the poverty line (according to federal poverty guidelines), a number lower than the national average of 11.5%.
- **Females (9.0%)** are the highest between the two sex categories, and **Black or African Americans (31.7%)** are the highest percent below the poverty line for the racial groups, in Olmsted County.

Percent below Poverty by Age (2022)

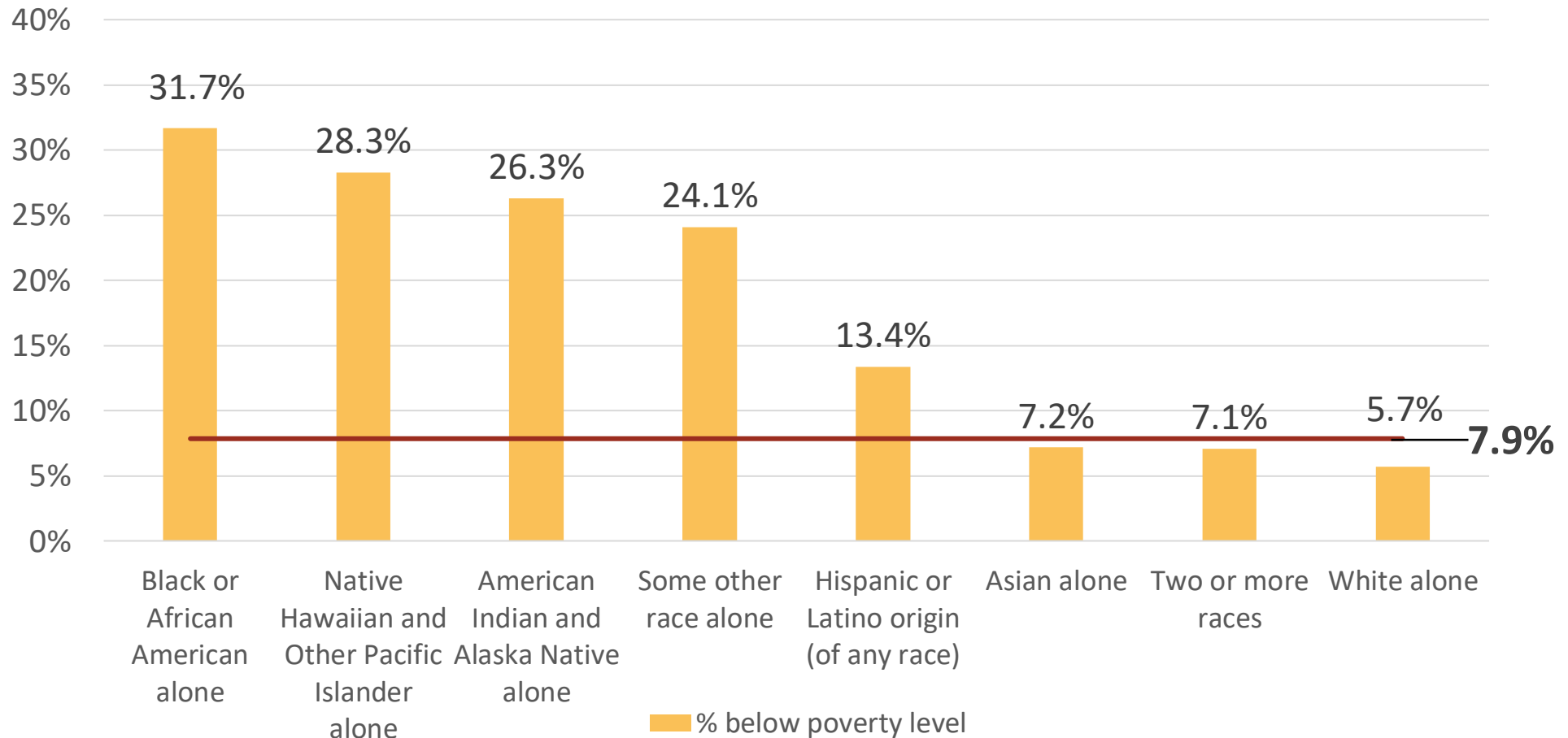

- Black or African American population have the highest percentage of people below the poverty line at **31.7%**, followed by Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander at 28.3%.

Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) 2023

➤ Mental Health

34% of adults report having a mental health issue
(↑ from 29.0% in 2019)

➤ Access to Healthcare

32% of adults report delaying any type of access to healthcare
(↑ from 27.0% in 2019)

➤ Drug Use

17% of adults use drugs (↑ from 14.5% in 2018)

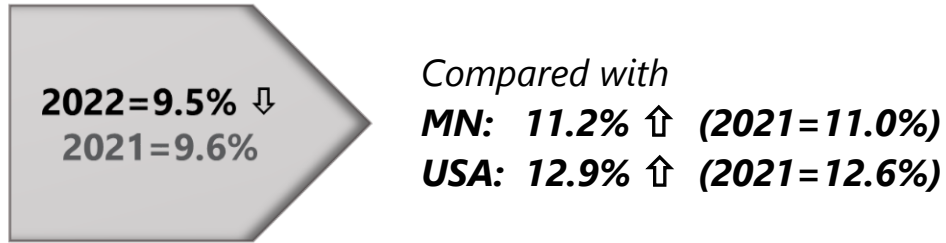

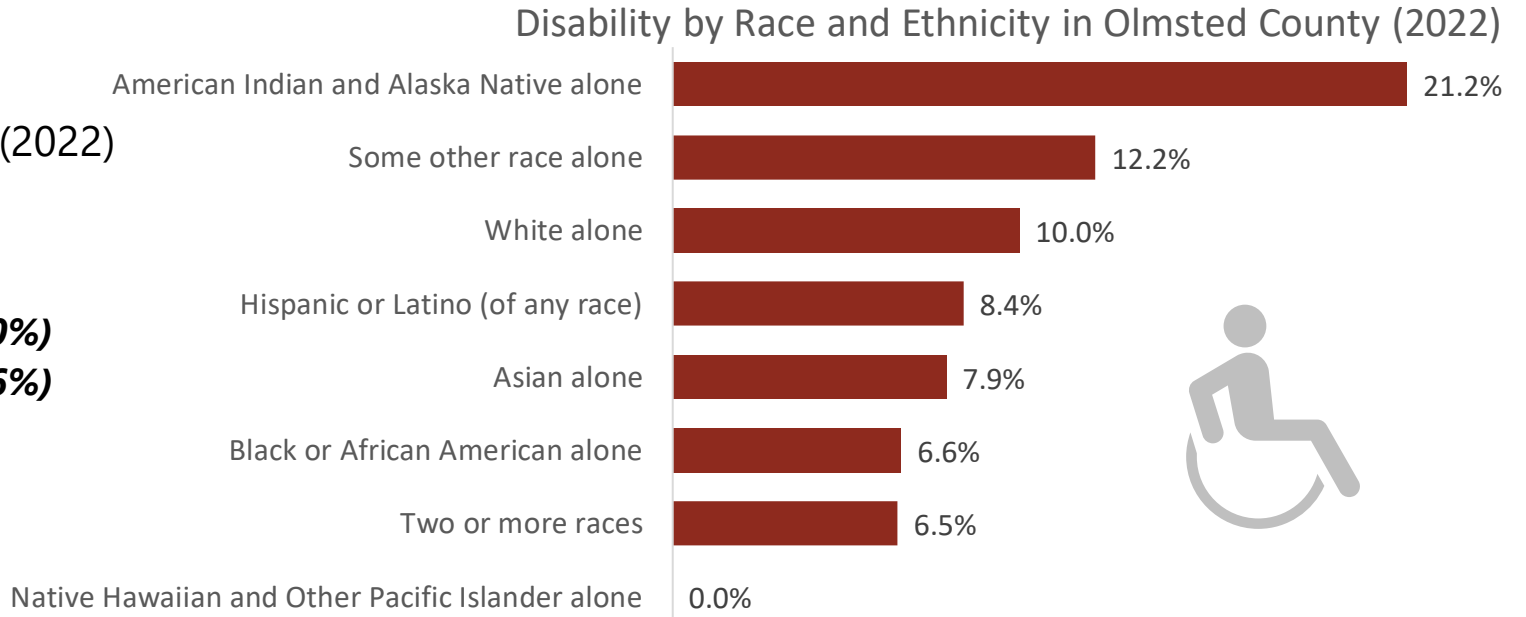

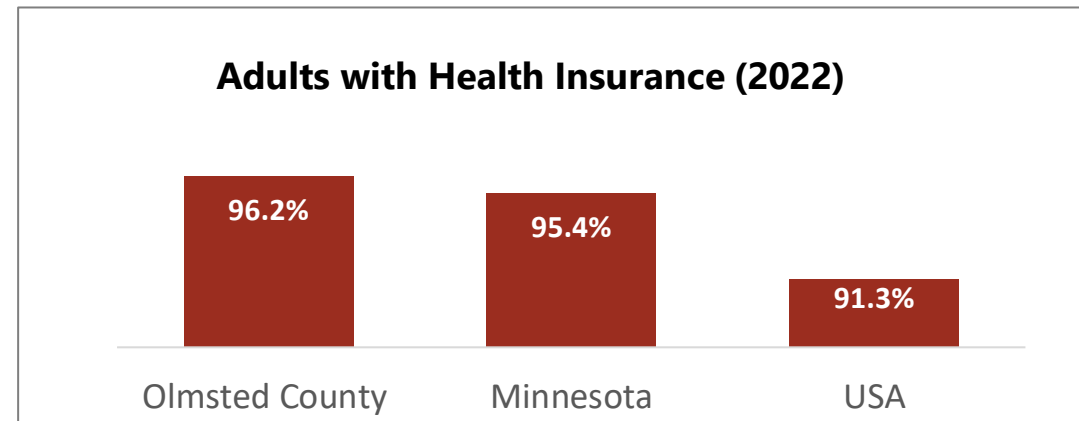

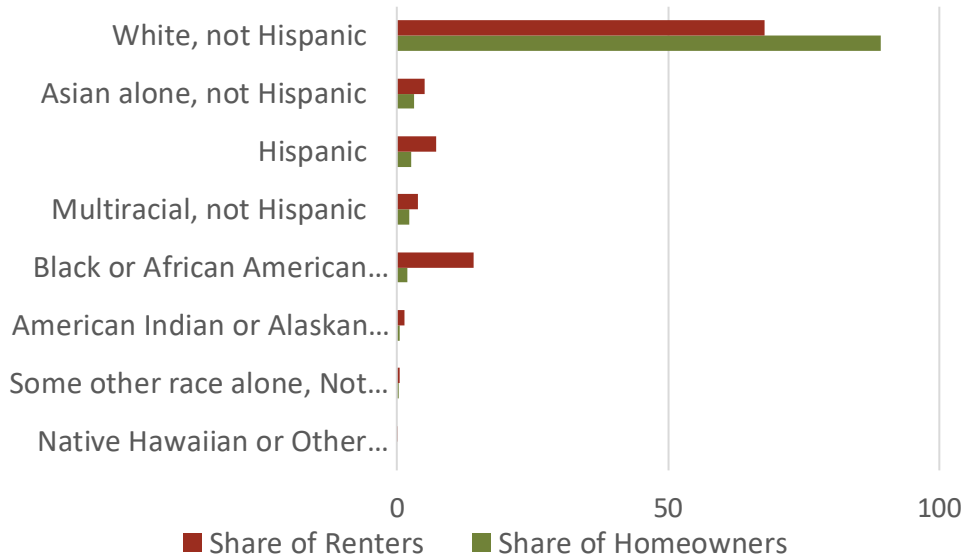


Adults with Health Insurance (2022)

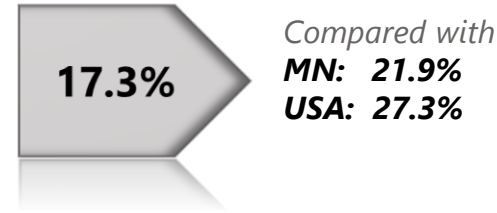

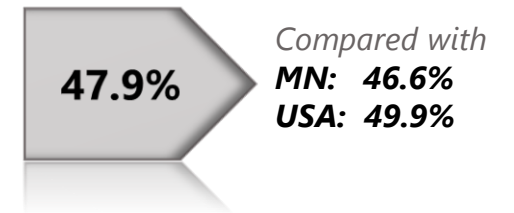
Share of Homeowners and Renters by Race and Ethnicity 2020 in Minnesota

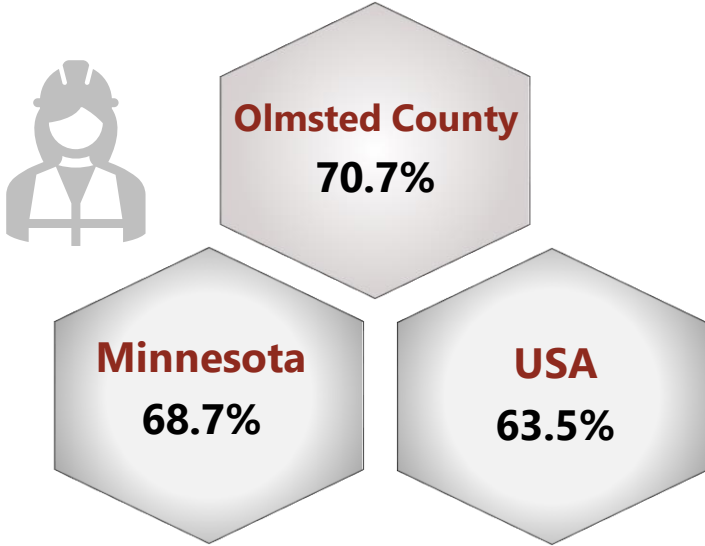

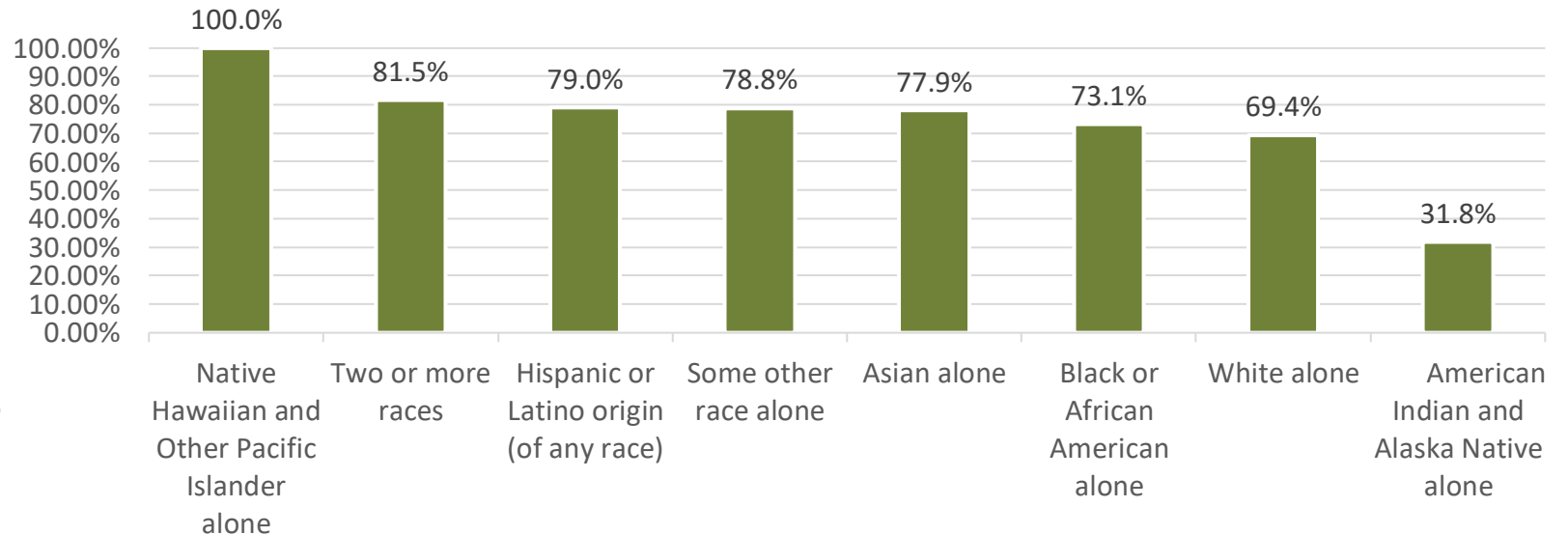


Labor Force



- Olmsted County had a higher labor force participation rate than MN and the nation.
- 12.0% of employees worked from home in Olmsted County as compared to 17.1% in MN and 15.13% in the nation.
- Olmsted County also hires a higher number of employees with any disability (60.6%) when compared to MN (54.4%).

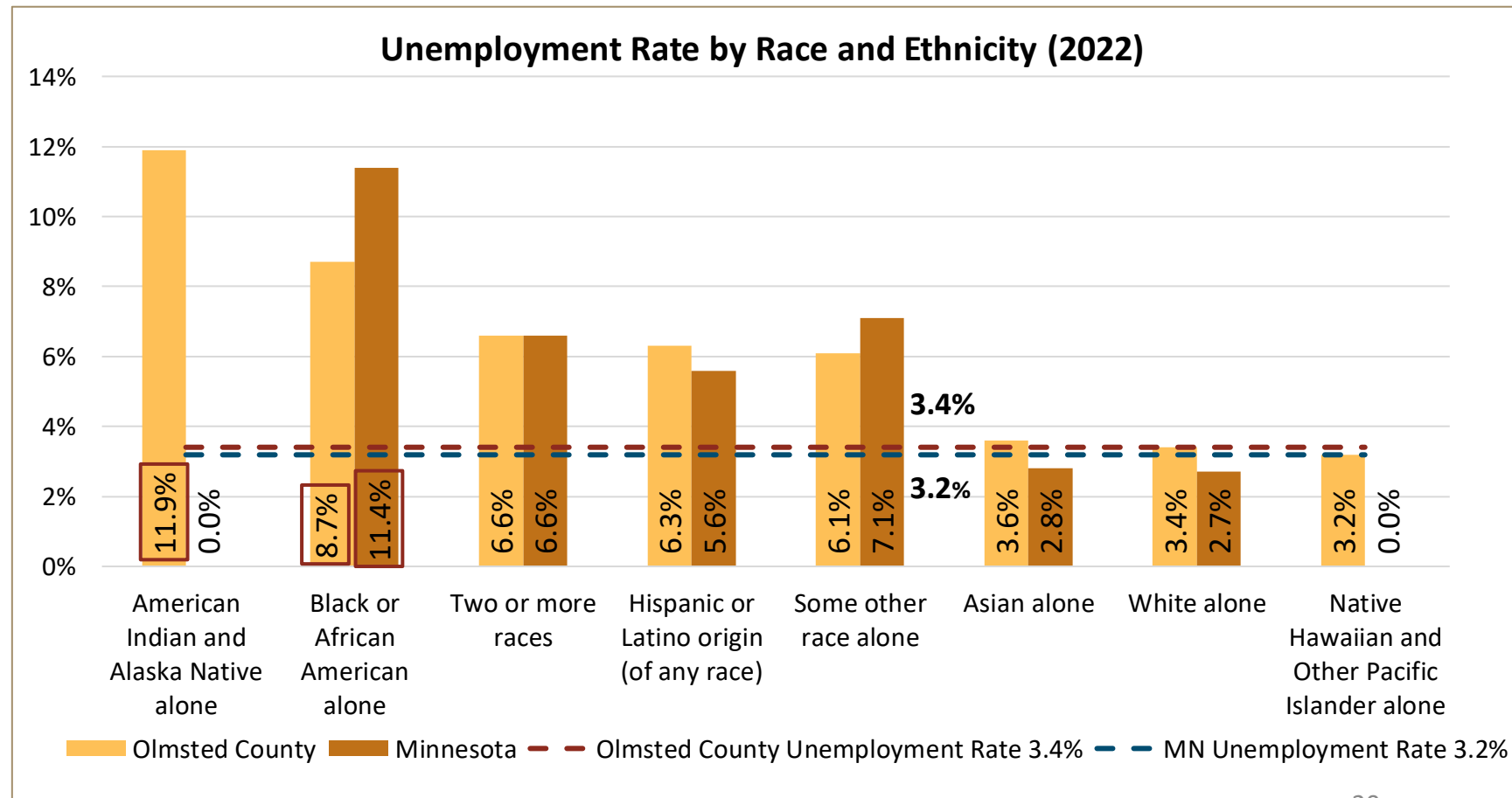

- Olmsted County's overall unemployment rate was higher than the state.
- The unemployment rates within the racial & ethnic categories- Black or African American and Some Other Race were higher than MN.



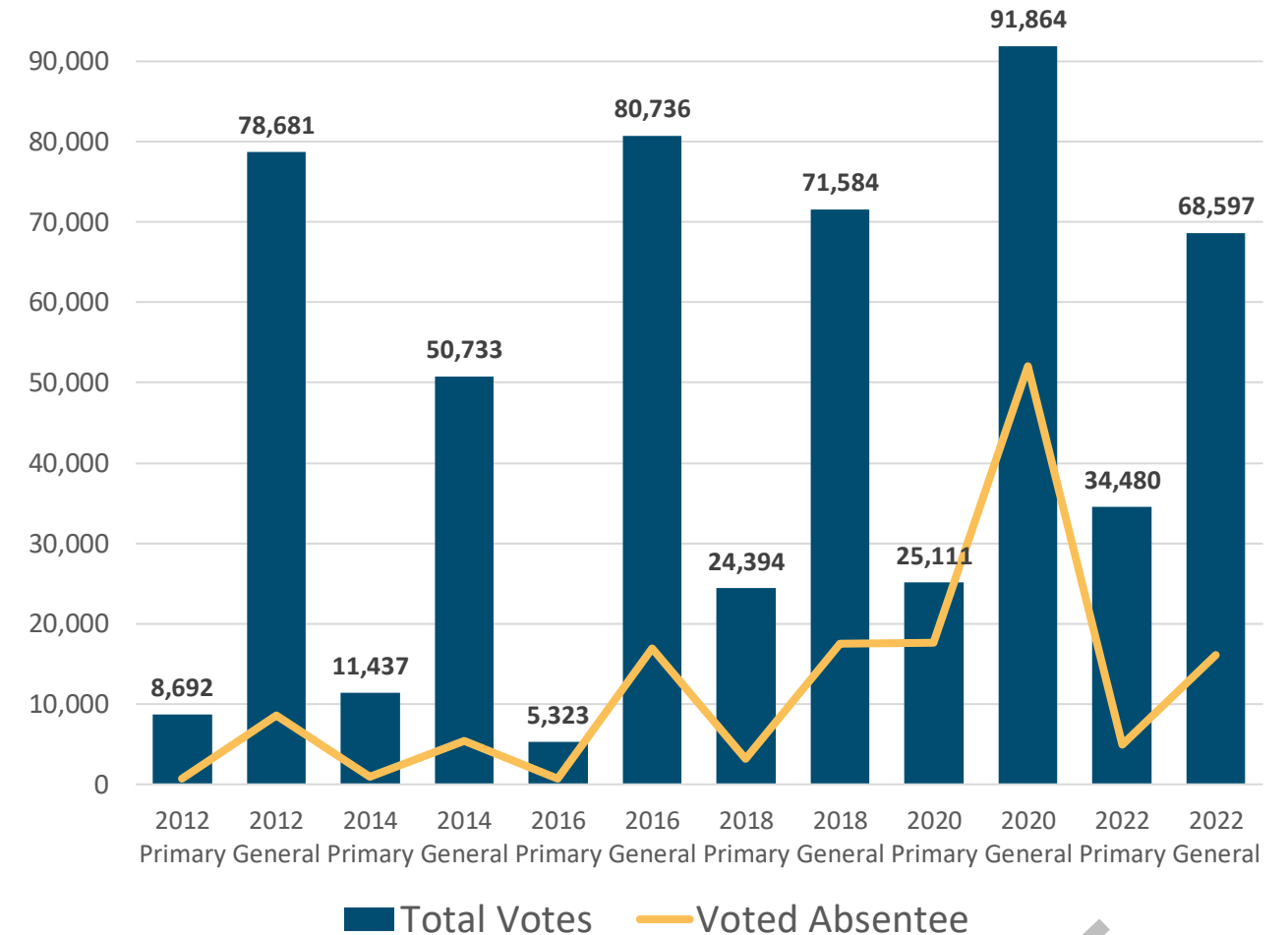
Election Trends

- Olmsted County observed an overall decrease in voter turnout in 2022 (66%) compared to 2020 (86%).
- Absentee voting in 2022 returned to pre-pandemic levels.

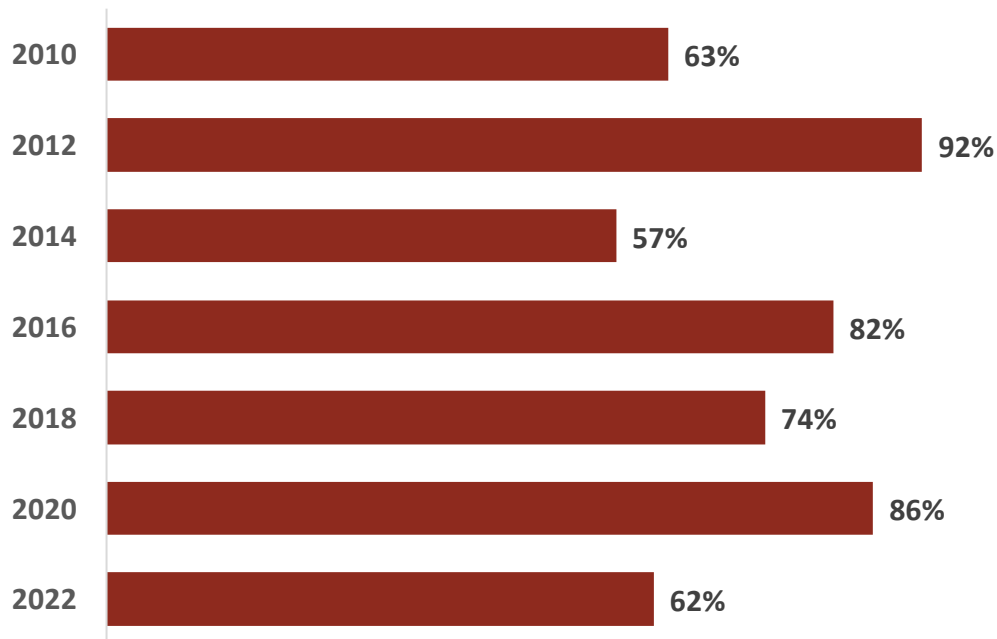

Community Safety

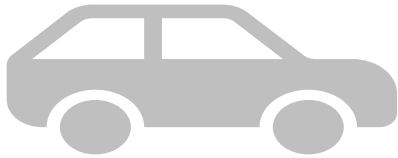


- The table shows the three-year data of crime reported in Olmsted County and the City of Rochester.
- The data is collected from the FBI information services division, and the county's data does not overlap with the City of Rochester's data.
- The location type for crimes was highest at residence home followed by highway/alley/street/sidewalk.

Outdoor Air Quality 2023

87% of days are considered good air quality days in Olmsted County

Indoor Air Quality 2023

44% of homes tested for radon were above the health action limit, needing remediation.

Private Well Water Quality in Olmsted County 2023

9% of well owners tested their water

15% were positive for Bacteria

35% are impacted by Nitrates

3% have Nitrates above 10 ppm

18% tested above detection limits for Arsenic

16% tested above 50 ppb for Manganese



- Approximately **9,000 households** served by private wells.
 - **20% of our population** gets their drinking water from a private well.
- Private wells shared by 3-4 homes.
- 54% of Olmsted County private wells are of unknown construction or constructed prior to the 1974 MN State Well Code.



Olmsted County Highlights

- 7th largest population among Minnesota counties.
- Overall, the county surpasses state and national rates in many areas:
 - Higher percentage of adults with bachelor's degrees or higher.
 - Higher mean individual income for certain groups.
 - Higher number of employees with any disability.
 - More days with healthy air quality.
 - Lower poverty rate overall.
- Like the state and the nation, disparities exist in the county, such as:
 - Unemployment and poverty are higher for non-whites.
 - Mean individual income and labor force participation are lower for American Indian & Alaska Native, Asian, and "Some other Race" groups.
 - Homeownership is lower for non-whites.
 - Disabilities are higher for American Indian and Alaska Native group.
